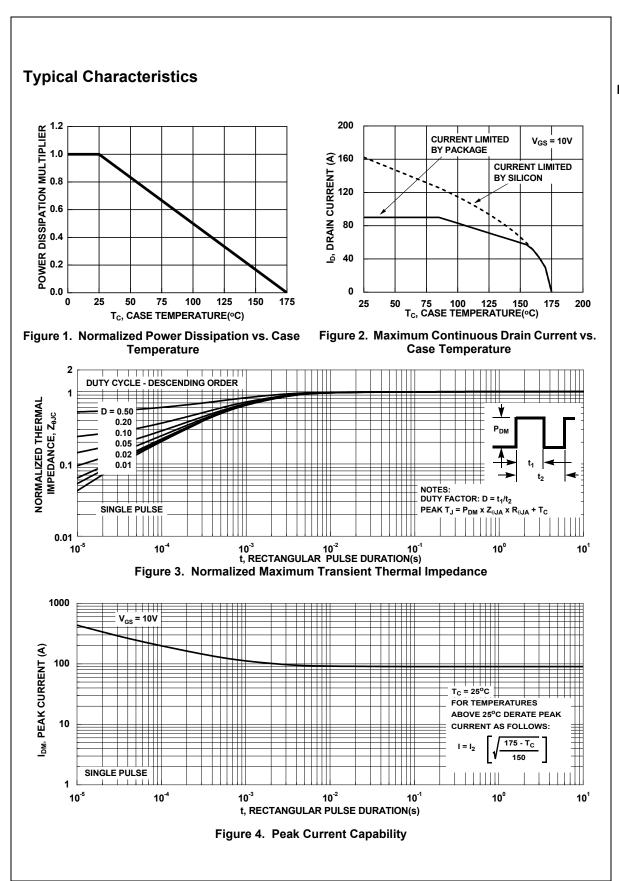

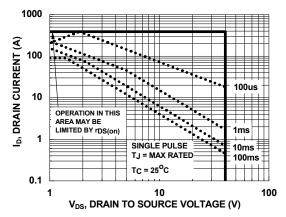
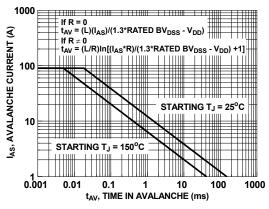


Figure 5. Forward Bias Safe Operating Area

Capability

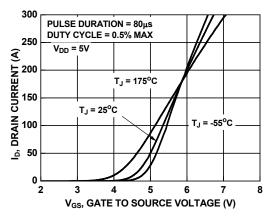


Figure 7. Transfer Characteristics

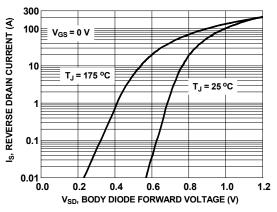


Figure 8. Forward Diode Characteristics

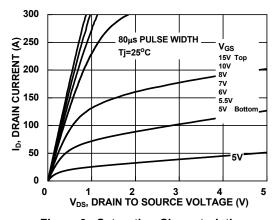


Figure 9. Saturation Characteristics

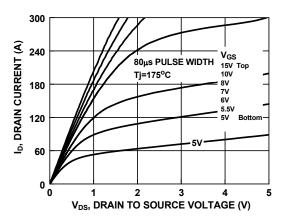


Figure 10. Saturation Characteristics

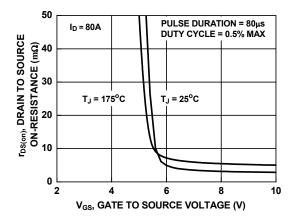


Figure 11. R<sub>DSON</sub> vs. Gate Voltage

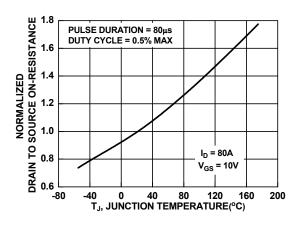


Figure 12. Normalized R<sub>DSON</sub> vs. Junction Temperature

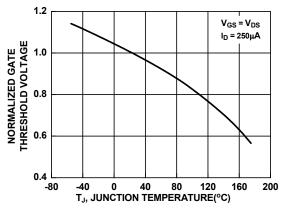


Figure 13. Normalized Gate Threshold Voltage vs. Temperature

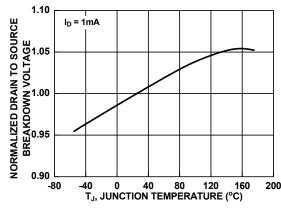


Figure 14. Normalized Drain--Source Breakdown Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

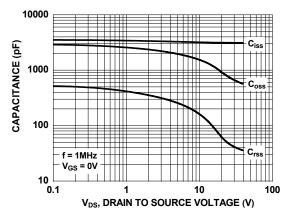


Figure 15. Capacitance vs. Drain--Source Voltage

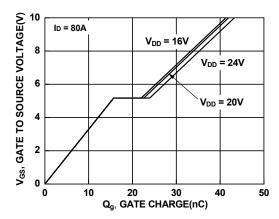


Figure 16. Gate Charge vs. Gate--Source Voltage

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
