# **Dual N-Channel Logic Level PWM Optimized PowerTrench® MOSFET**

### **General Description**


These N-Channel Logic Level MOSFETs have been designed specifically to improve the overall efficiency of DC/DC converters using either synchronous or conventional switching PWM controllers.


These MOSFETs feature faster switching and lower gate charge than other MOSFETs with comparable RDS(ON) specifications.

The result is a MOSFET that is easy and safer to drive (even at very high frequencies), and DC/DC power supply designs with higher overall efficiency.

b) 125°/W when mounted on a 0.02 in² pad of 2 oz copper




c) 135°/W when mounted on a minimum mounting pad.


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

Figure 1. On-Region Characteristics.









Figure 3. On-Resistance Variation withTemperature.

Figure 4. On-Resistance Variation with Gate-to-Source Voltage.







Figure 5. Transfer Characteristics.





Figure 7. Gate Charge Characteristics.

Figure 8. Capacitance Characteristics.






Figure 9. Maximum Safe Operating Area.

Figure 10. Single Pulse Maximum Power Dissipation.




Figure 11. Transient Thermal Response Curve.
